Everyone involved in this year's 'Polar Explorers' Holiday Club had a great time. Each day began with a 'Polar Challenge' and this included such things as a memory game and a scavenger hunt with items linked to going on an expedition. We also heard a story from Random Finds which linked to a daily 'Polar Phrase' about being part of God's big expedition.

The 'Polar Phrase' encouraged the children to understand that everyone no matter how young or old, how many mistakes we've made or how ordinary we might think we are can help spread the Good News and these phrases formed the basis for each day's activities. The 'Polar Explorers' song was sung daily both at the beginning and end of each session with an increasing array of actions being added as the week progressed! What started out as a seemingly tricky song soon became quite catchy and the children really enjoying singing it.

The children were divided into groups with the younger ones enjoying a daily Bible story led by Janet and the older children watching a story from the DVD. Summer has more or less been and gone! We've been busy at Chapel as usual although there hasn't been any Guild or Women's Own during July and August.

On 11th July we had our evening Summer Fayre. It was even better than usual – a lot of trouble had gone into making the Barn look attractive and a lot of people came. There was a lovely atmosphere there and we raised over £800 for church funds.

Each year the Horticultural Society has a big show and hires a huge marque at the local pub. To make further use of it, we hold a combined 'café style' service in it with the local parish church. On 26th July everyone was welcomed with coffee/tea and a plate of scones and sweetmeats. The subject this year was about the agencies that help to support those in need, particularly in the poorer countries. Whilst we were sitting waiting for the service to begin there was a quiz to unscramble words to reveal ten of these agencies. At the end were asked to write down the one thing we would take with us if we had to leave home in a great hurry – what was most important to us! My idea was a family photograph and I know some people said their Bible. We were also asked to write down a number of things we would take with us if we had the room and the time. It was an interesting exercise and made us think – what is important to you if you have nothing!!

In the afternoon it was the Circuit Safar Tea followed by the Farewell Service for the Rev. Andrew. We shall miss him, but look forward to the Circuit Welcome Service for Rev. Sarah Parkins who will take over. We will be meeting her on Sunday 30th August at Caistor.

On 5th August the Guild and Women's Own joined together on an outing to Burnby Hall Gardens and Museum and then the McArthur-Glenn Designer Outlet at York. I understand it was much enjoyed.

Ray Wylie reminded us before the service today that it is only about six weeks before our Harvest Festival and Concert and then it will be autumn – the 'season of mists and mellow fruitfulness'! Already, the brambles are ripening on the briars and the rowan tree berries and rosehips are turning orange!! The farmers are getting their cereal crops in.

Ken Knapston's sermon on 2nd August was about bread and it being the staple of our lives. How each meal seems to include bread and the numerous times in the Bible people were fed with bread even the manna in the dessert for the Israelites.

People tend to look back on what they think of as the 'good old days' when they weren't really. They just seemed so at the time! God will always fulfil our need if only we have faith. That is what the refugees are looking for – a better life than the one they have left!

Dan Owen in his sermon on 19th July talked about the people having faith in Jesus. He (Jesus) expected to be made welcome but wasn't – he was rejected. He didn't belong to the right group – He was a carpenter's son – they had grown up him – yes –they believed He could heal them, but they hadn't actually much faith in Him – He couldn't be the Messiah! Do we go to church to meet 'nice' people? Are they 'one of us'? True faith can be found anywhere- even outside the Christian belief (e.g. Muslims). In the 9/11 episode, everyone was helping each other whatever their colour or creed.

Rev. Michael Sheard preached on 9th August about stereotypes. What is a typical picture of a man or a woman or a teenager etc.? A Christian? God Himself? What qualities do we look for, what expectations?

He forecasted that in the next two decades, 47% of jobs would be taken over by technology – robotics – and its true already if you think about it!!! He also added 'He who comes to me (God) will change the World'!

"Obstacles are simply stepping stones". 'Youth would be an ideal state of mind if it came a little later in life'. On the other hand, how often have you heard it said 'If only I knew then what I know now – life would be very different'?!!!!
